Title VI and ADA Program

Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964

Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, prohibits discrimination based upon race, color, and national origin. Specifically, 42 USC 2000d states that "No person in the United States shall, on the ground of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance."

The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (Department) hereby gives notice that it is the policy of the Department to assure full compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987, E.O. 12898, and related statutes and regulations in all programs and activities. Title VI requires that no person in the United States shall, on the grounds of race, color or national origin be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program or activity administered by the Department.

Any person who believes they have been aggrieved by a discriminatory practice under Title VI has a right to file a formal complaint with the Department or Surrey. Any such complaint must be in writing and filed with the Department's Title VI Coordinator within one hundred eighty (180) days following the date of the alleged discriminatory occurrence.

Additional Types of Prohibited Discrimination

Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 originally banned discrimination based on race, color, or national origin. PennDOT's Title VI Program includes other federal and Commonwealth nondiscrimination authorities which prohibit discrimination based on age, sex, religious creed, disability, limited English proficiency and low-income.

Americans with Disabilities Act

PennDot and Surrey do not discriminate on the basis of disability in admission to, access to, or operations of its programs, services, or activities and has established a grievance procedure to meet the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act. 28 CFR 35.149 Discrimination prohibited. "Except as otherwise provided in 35.150, no qualified individual with a disability shall, because a public entity's facilities are inaccessible to or unusable by individuals with disabilities, be excluded from participation in or be denied the benefits of the services, programs or activities of a public entity, or be subjected to discrimination by any public entity."

Title VI applies to all Department of Transportation activities and programs. The ban on discrimination includes any PennDOT program or activity as well as those provided by our municipal partners and organizations receiving funding through PennDOT.

Titles II and III of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA) provide that no entity shall discriminate against an individual with a disability in connection with the provision of transportation services. The laws sets forth specific requirements for vehicle and facility accessibility and the provision of service, including complementary paratransit service. Grantees must keep Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) accessibility features on all vehicles, equipment, and facilities in good operating order. Complaint filing and resolution.

Title VI

Surrey must ensure that no person shall, on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participating in, or be denied the benefits of, or be subject to discrimination under any program, or activity receiving Federal financial assistance without regard to whether specific projects or services are federally funded. The grantee must ensure that all transit services and related benefits are distributed in an equitable manner.

Complaint procedures and resolution

Surrey has a procedure in place to respond to and track complaints alleging discrimination due to a disability. The ADA complaint form and process is made available to all by being posted in Surrey's vehicles as well as in Surrey's Transportation Department and on Surrey's website.

Any person who believes they have been discriminated against should complete a Discrimination Complaint Form and forward it to Surrey's HR Department. Complaints will be promptly and thoroughly investigated by Surrey's HR Department. Responses will be sent to the complainant within a reasonable period of time.

Complaints can also be sent to one of the agencies mentioned above (PennDOT Bureau of Equal Opportunity and/or Pennsylvania Human Relations Commission (PHRC) for investigation.
